Keeping the commandments will help me know they are true.

Possible Activity 'A'

- ▶ Summarize [John 7:17](#) in words the children will understand.
- ▶ Obeying the commandments helps us feel closer to Jesus Christ, perhaps by singing together [“Keep the Commandments”](#) or [“Choose the Right Way,”](#) *Children’s Songbook*, 146–47, 160–61.
- ▶ Listen for how we will be blessed when we keep the commandments.


Possible Activity 'B'

- ▶ Share an experience when you learned a commandment was from God because you lived it, such as paying tithing or forgiving someone who was unkind.
- ▶ Think of an experience you had when you obeyed a commandment.
- ▶ “How did you feel after you obeyed?”

Possible Activity 'C'

- ▶ Select some of the commandments and draw two sets of simple pictures that represent each commandment.
- ▶ Lay all of the pictures face down on the ground and take turns matching the commandments together.
- ▶ Testify of the importance of commandments and how following them has strengthened your testimony.

Possible Activity 'A'

- ▶ Repeat what Jesus said about Heavenly Father in [John 8:29](#): “I do always those things that please him.”
- ▶ Share things Jesus did that made Heavenly Father happy.
- ▶ Show them some pictures from the [Gospel Art Book](#) to give them ideas.

- ▶ What makes you happy.


Possible Activity 'A'

- ▶ Draw a picture that represents something in the parable of the good shepherd, like sheep, a robber, or a wolf.
- ▶ Read [John 10:1–18](#), and hold up your pictures when they hear read about what they drew.
- ▶ Explain that just like the “good shepherd” guides and loves his flock, Jesus loves us and guides us all back to Him.
- ▶ Dress up one of the children like a shepherd, and let the children share how Jesus is like a shepherd to us.
- ▶ Sing with the children [“The Wise Man and the Foolish Man,”](#) *Children’s Songbook*, 281, and use actions to go along with the words.

Older Possible 1

Keeping the commandments will help me know they are true. - Possible Activity 'A'


- ▶ Write each verse of [John 7:14–17](#) on different pieces of paper and display them in random order.
- ▶ Ask the children to put them in the correct order and check [John 7:14–17](#) to see if they are right.
- ▶ Invite the children to split into pairs and share their understanding of each verse with their partner.
- ▶ How has obedience to God's commandments helped them know the commandments are true?

- ▶ Share examples from the scriptures showing how people were blessed for living gospel truths, such as Daniel (see [Daniel 6](#)) or Nephi (see [1 Nephi 3–4](#)).

- ▶ A few days before class, invite one of the children to write about a time when he or she gained a testimony of a commandment by living it.
- ▶ During class, ask the child to share what he or she wrote.




Older Possible 2

Possible Activity 'A'

- ▶ Invite the children to read [John 8:31–36](#) and share what they think it means to be a servant of sin.
- ▶ How do the teachings of Jesus help us be free?

Possible Activity 'B'

- ▶ Ask a child to help you lightly wrap a rope, scarf, or necktie around your wrists to demonstrate how we become bound to sin when we commit it over and over again without repenting.

Possible Activity 'C'

- ▶ Show a lock to represent sin and a key to represent how truths of the gospel can make us free.
- ▶ For example, knowing about the Savior's Atonement can give us freedom to repent and be forgiven of our sins.
- ▶ Or knowing about the Word of Wisdom can give us freedom to avoid addictions.


Possible Activity 'A'

- ▶ Write *good shepherd* and *hireling* on the board.
- ▶ Explain that a hireling is someone who is hired to do a job for money.
- ▶ List differences you find in [John 10:1–18](#) between a good shepherd and a hireling.
- ▶ Why would you want to follow the good shepherd rather than the hireling?







- ▶ **2** Therefore when thou doest *thine* alms, do not sound a trumpet before thee, as the ^ahypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may have ^bglory of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward.
- ▶ **3** But when thou doest alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth:





- ▶ **17** But thou when thou fastest, anoint thine head, and wash thy face;
- ▶ **18** That thou appear not unto men to ^afast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall ^breward thee openly.
- ▶ **19** ¶ Lay not up for yourselves ^atreasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves ^bbreak through and steal:
- ▶ **20** But lay up for yourselves ^atreasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor ^bsteal:
- ▶ **21** For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

- ▶ **Matthew 6-7**
- ▶ **22** The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine ^aeye be ^bsingle, thy whole body shall be full of ^clight.
- ▶ **23** But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that ^adarkness!
- ▶ **24 ¶** ^aNo man can ^bserve two ^cmasters: for either he will ^dhate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and ^emammon.
- ▶ **25** ^aTherefore I say unto you, Take no ^bthought for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment?

- ▶ **26** Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they?

 - ▶ **28** And why take ye thought for raiment? ^aConsider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin:
 - ▶ **29** And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.
 - ▶ **30** Wherefore, if God so clothe the grass of the field, which to day is, and to morrow is cast into the oven, ^ashall he not much more *clothe* you, O ye of little ^bfaith?

- ▶ **Matthew 6-7**
- ▶ **31** Take therefore no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed?
- ▶ **32** (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father ^aknoweth that ye have need of all these things.
- ▶ **33** ^aBut ^bseek ye first the ^ckingdom of God, and his ^drighteousness; and all these ^ethings shall be ^fadded unto you.
- ▶ **34** Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take ^athought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day *is* the evil thereof.

- ▶ **1** ^aJudge not that ye be not ^bjudged.
- ▶ **2** For with what ^ajudgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what ^bmeasure ye mete, it shall be ^cmeasured to you again.
- ▶ **3** ^aAnd why beholdest thou the ^bmote that is in thy brother's eye, but considerest not the ^cbeam that is in thine own eye?
- ▶ **4** Or how wilt thou say to thy brother, Let me pull out the mote out of thine eye; and, behold, a beam is in thine own eye?
- ▶ **5** Thou ^ahypocrite, first cast out the beam out of thine own eye; and then shalt thou see clearly to cast out the mote out of thy brother's eye.


- ▶ **6 ¶** Matthew 6-7 ¶ Give me that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn again and rend you.
- ▶ **7 ¶** ^aAsk, and it shall be given you; ^cseek, and ye shall find; ^dknock, and it shall be opened unto you:
- ▶ **8** For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.
- ▶ **9** Or what man is there of you, whom if his son ask bread, will he give him a stone?
- ▶ **10** Or if he ask a fish, will he give him a serpent?

▶ **11** Matthew 6:7 *If ye think ^abeing evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good things to them that ask him?*

▶ **12** Therefore all things ^awhatsoever ye would that ^bmen should ^cdo to you, ^ddo ye even so to them: for this is the ^elaw and the prophets.

▶ **13** ¶ Enter ye in at the ^astrait ^bgate: for wide *is* the gate, and broad *is* the way, that leadeth to ^cdestruction, and many there be which go in thereat:

▶ **14** Because ^astrait *is* the ^bgate, and narrow *is* the way, which leadeth unto ^clife, and few there be that find it.

- ▶ **15** Beware of a false prophets, which come to you in b sheep's clothing, but c inwardly they are ravening d wolves.
- ▶ **16** Ye shall a know them by their b fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles?
- ▶ **17** Even so every good tree bringeth forth a good b fruit; but a c corrupt tree bringeth forth d evil fruit.
- ▶ **18** A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit.
- ▶ **19** Every tree that bringeth not forth good a fruit is b hewn down, and cast into the fire.

▶ **20** Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them.


