- The organ has 11,623 pipes.
- The pipes are made of wood, zinc and various alloys of tin and lead.
- The pipes are controlled from a console.
- The longest pipe has a length of 32 feet.
- The shortest pipe is three-quarters of an inch.
- Two technicians are employed full time to maintain this and other musical instruments.
- There are around 360 people in the choir.
- The Choir has appeared at 13 world's fairs and expositions, performed at the inaugurations of five U.S. presidents and sung for numerous worldwide telecasts and special events.
- Five of the Choir's recordings have achieved "gold record" and two have achieved "platinum record" status.
- The choir was founded in August 1847, one month after the pioneers entered the Salt Lake Valley.
- Music and the Spoken Word is now broadcast worldwide through some 1500 radio and TV stations.





When he became President, there were over 13 million members with the majority of the membership living outside the United States and Canada.




His father was a renowned chemist teaching at Princeton University. His mother, an assistant professor who headed the women's physical education department at the University of Utah, was on leave from the department pursuing a doctoral degree at the University of Wisconsin when his parents met.

His Great-Grandfather met Swiss immigrant Mary Bommeli when he joined her pioneer company on his trek to Utah following his mission. Mary, whose family joined the Church when she was 24, had been incarcerated in Berlin, Germany, for sharing the gospel. The night she was arrested, she wrote a letter to the judge and encouraged him to repent and save himself and family from "great sorrow." The judge soon dropped the charges, and Mary was released. Henry and Mary married shortly thereafter.

He was head of Ricks College – now Brigham Young University-Idaho.






He is only the eleventh apostle to be born outside the United States. He is the second member of the First Presidency who is not a native English speaker. President Uchtdorf is the first German apostle in church history and was the first born outside of North America since the death of John A. Widtsoe in 1952. He is the first resident of a country outside the United States or Canada to be called to be a general authority who later became an apostle.

It was while attending mutual as a thirteen year old, that he first met the girl, Harriet Reich, who would later became his wife.

It was while waiting in a food line that the young Dieter and his grandmother were introduced to the Gospel. (He was six years old at the time).


13th Article of Faith Sudoku
