

1. Write out your goal in your Personal Progress book under a value of your choice, and have your leader or parent approve it.

2. Make a General Conference notebook. It can be as simple or as fancy as you wish. You could decorate a regular notebook with paper, embellishments or pictures of apostles and prophets from the church website. Make sure you keep track of your time. J 3. Listen to all four sessions of General Conference, taking notes of every speaker, and being especially aware of any speaker whose subject matter is dealing with the value you have chosen.

For April's Conference, you can also watch the Young Women's broadcast and take notes on that session as well.

4. After or between sessions look at your notes (especially concentrating on the speakers who have spoken about your chosen value). Have your scriptures nearby. For the other two or less hours of your project, write a summary of what you have learned about your value. You may include the following ideas:

a. Faith or Knowledge: Write about how your faith or knowledge has increased by listening to the words of the prophets. Include ideas about how your testimony of the prophet has grown.

b. Divine Nature, Individual Worth, or Integrity: Write about any new ideas you have on how you can increase your divine nature, individual worth, or integrity. Include your testimony of these important values.

c. Choice and Accountability: Write about your choice to listen to all sessions of conference. Include ideas on how conference affected you, as well as your testimony of the importance of making good choices.
d. Good Works: Write about ideas that you have come up with for doing service to others.
Refer to specific examples from the talks you have heard. Write about the importance of showing gratitude for the unspoken service all around you, especially from family members.
e. Remember that all Conference talks will be posted

at lds.org three days after Conference is over, in case you need to refer to them again.

5. By now, you should have completed your 10-hour project! Evaluate your project in your Personal Progress book, and have it signed off by your parent or leader. Be sure to show them your awesome General Conference notebook. They will for sure be impressed!

- Re-read your notes. Remember the inspiration you had while you were listening to conference. Make goals right away to motivate you to do what you felt inspired to do.





- The organ has 11,623 pipes.

- The pipes are made of wood, zinc and various alloys of tin and lead.

The pipes are controlled from a console.
The longest pipe has a length of 32 feet.

- The shortest pipe is three-quarters of an inch.

- Two technicians are employed full time to maintain this and other musical instruments.

- There are around 360 people in the choir.

- The Choir has appeared at 13 world's fairs and expositions, performed at the inaugurations of five U.S. presidents and sung for numerous worldwide telecasts and special events.


Five of the Choir's recordings have achieved "gold record" and two have achieved "platinum record" status.
The choir was founded in August 1847. one month after the pioneers entered the Salt Lake Valley.

In December 1981, U.S. President Ronald Reagan appointed him to the President's Task Force for Private Sector Initiatives. He remained with the initiative until it completed its work in Dec. 1982. When he was born, there were fewer than 650,000 members of the church in the world, with most of them being based in the Western United States. When he became President, there were over 13 million members with the majority of the membership living outside the United States and Canada.

Did you know that he taught for a time at the University of Utah, and then began a career in publishing? His first job was with the Deseret News, where he became an advertising executive.

His Great-Grandfather met Swiss immigrant Mary Bommeli when he joined her pioneer company on his trek to Utah following his mission. Mary, whose family joined the Church when she was 24, had been incarcerated in Berlin, Germany, for sharing the

gospel. The night she was arrested, she wrote a letter to the judge and encouraged him to repent and save himself and

repent and save himself and family from "great sorrow." The judge soon dropped the charges, and Mary was released. Henry and Mary married shortly thereafter. His father was a renowned chemist teaching at Princeton University. His mother, an assistant professor who headed the women's physical education department at the University of Utah, was on leave from the department pursuing a doctoral degree at the University of Wisconsin when his parents

Wisconsin when his parent met. He was head of Ricks College - now Brigham Young University Idaho.

Born: November 6, 1940 Current Age: 72 Married: Harriet Reich Uchtdorf Children: 2 Occupation: Pilot. He is only the eleventh apostle to be born outside the United States. He is the second member of the First Presidency who is not a native English speaker. President Uchtdorf is the first German apostle in church history and was the first born outside of North America since the death of John A. Widtsoe in 1952. He is the first resident of a country outside the United States or Canada to be called to be a general authority who later became an apostle.


